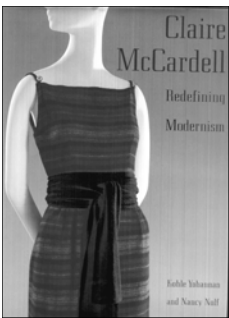

DIARY OF JACOB ENGELBRECHT

From 1819 to 1878, the tailor, sometimes shopkeeper, Frederick mayor, and social commentator noted events, significant and trivial, local and international, in his diary. Engelbrecht included topics as varied as the Marquis de Lafayette's visit in 1824 and the Civil War, buying lottery tickets, gardening, and making sauerkraut in his diary. He included the activities of his daily life as well as his thoughts about the issues of his day, including slavery and national politics. The diarist also recorded marriages and other milestones of the community which offer a glimpse of social trends and realities of the period. The deluxe edition is printed as a hard cover, two-volume set on acid-free paper. It includes over 1,200 pages of entries, a comprehensive index, and translations of German passages included in the original diary.

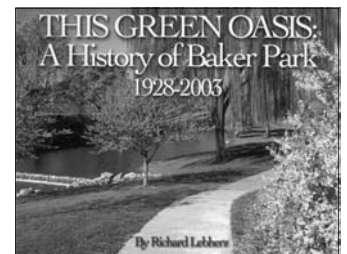


CLAIRE MCCARDELL: REDEFINING MODERNISM

Frederick native and acclaimed fashion innovator Claire McCardell is credited with creating an American style of casual dress that still endures today. "She was a pioneer of minimalism, an innovator of modernism, and...provided women with designs that stressed comfort, practicality, and integrity." McCardell eschewed couture and instead created what is now known as the classic "American Look." McCardell graced the cover of *Time* in 1958, at a time when her influence had pervaded the country. The handsome hard cover book by Kohle Yohannan and Nancy Nolf follows her from her beginning in Frederick to the height of her fame and untimely death in 1958 and features full-color photos throughout.

THIS GREEN OASIS: A HISTORY OF BAKER PARK 1928-2003

Richard Leberz created this history and pictorial presentation of Frederick's park in celebration of its first 75 years. The history of the park is traced from idea, through the lives of Joseph Dill Baker and Lloyd C. Culler, to the present day. This hard cover book features many color photos.
